# PAHIATUA RAILCAR SOCIETY

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December 2022 Jean and I attended an open day at the Pahiatua Railcar Society. The inclement weather did not detract the hundreds of people that travelled to Pahiatua specifically for this event. On show were examples of all the common types of railcars operated by NZR in the North Island.

The centre piece was a fully restored and working "Wairarapa Class Railcar" dating back to the days of the Remutaka Incline (photo 1). Note the cut out in the front pilot to clear the centre rail.

Operations in the yard were dominated by a "Standard Class Railcar" and Silver Fern Railcars taking passengers on rides to various destinations (photo 2).

The high level of workmanship put into these restorations was on display inside the workshops where an NZR Drewry Class Articulated Twinset Railcar is under restoration. Photo 3 shows the front half of the Drewry Twinset being rebuilt. Photo 4 shows the condition of a railcar body as delivered to the society's yard. Any group that has the skill set to make this transformation gets my vote.

Also on display were numerous restored diesel shunters and various other railway artefacts. This place is certainly worthy of a club visit. Negotiations are currently under way.
